

Town of Plover Refuse and Recycling Information Guide

The Town of Plover contracts with Advanced Disposal Services for weekly refuse (trash) and recycling services. Service occurs every Friday, except on weeks where their office is closed in recognition of certain holidays, **which fall on weekdays**. In these cases, collection will occur instead on Saturday.

2019 Holidays

- New Year's Day, January 1st – collection will occur Saturday, January 5th.
- Memorial Day, May 27th – collection will occur Saturday, June 1st.
- Independence Day, July 4th – collection will occur Saturday, July 6th.
- Labor Day, September 2nd – collection will occur Saturday, September 7th.
- Thanksgiving Day, November 28th – collection will occur Saturday, November 30th.
- Christmas Day, December 25th – collection will occur Saturday, December 28th.
- 2020 New Year's Day, January 1st – collection will occur Saturday, January 4th.

Single-Stream Recycling means all recyclable materials can go in one single bin. You no longer need to separate paper/cardboard from glass, plastics, or metals.

What goes in my recycling bin?



Glass Bottles/Jars



Clean Household Plastic Containers



Aseptic Containers



Paper & Cardboard



Aluminum

What kind of container should I place my recyclables in?
 Your recyclables can be mixed together and placed in any kind of a bin, basket, or small cart. Something that the driver can easily pick up to pour the contents into his/her truck.

Through the Town's contract with Advanced Disposal, trash carts are provided to residents; however, residents are responsible for providing their own recycling containers.

When we keep these recyclable materials out of the waste stream, there is less materials going into our Landfill, which ultimately saves our Town money, and helps to keep our taxes low!
